Deputy Prime Minister Oleg Serebrian met with the NATO Parliamentary Assembly delegation



On March 24, 2025, the Deputy Prime Minister for Reintegration, Oleg Serebrian, had a meeting with members of the delegation of the Parliamentary Assembly of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO PA), which is conducting a documentation visit to the Republic of Moldova during the period of March 24-25.

The delegation includes members of the NATO PA Subcommittee on Transatlantic Strengthening in the Field of Defense and Security, as well as of the NATO PA Subcommittee on Transition and Development. The discussions focused on the current situation in the process of settlement of the Transnistrian conflict, the main existing challenges, as well as the prospects for the country's reintegration policies in the context of the European integration of the Republic of Moldova.

Deputy Prime Minister Oleg Serebrian emphasized the need for a peaceful settlement of the Transnistrian conflict, respecting the sovereignty and territorial integrity of the Republic of Moldova within its internationally recognized borders, as well as ensuring the functionality of the reintegrated state and maintaining the country's European path.

The Deputy Prime Minister noted that approximately 93% of the population of the Transnistrian region is documented with national identity documents, all economic agents conducting foreign trade operations are registered with the Public Services Agency, and the right bank of the Nistru River continues to be a pole of attraction for the inhabitants of the Transnistrian region from an educational, social and economic point of view.

At the same time, the issues of energy security and the impact of the energy crisis on the region were addressed during the discussions.

Deputy Prime Minister Oleg Serebrian expressed appreciation for the interest shown in the Republic of Moldova and reiterated the commitment of the authorities in Chișinău to strengthen dialogue and cooperation with international partners in order to ensure regional stability and security.
