

2 406 economic agents from the Transnistrian region were registered and temporarily registered with the Public Services Agency at the end of 2024



According to the State Register of Legal Entities and Individual Entrepreneurs, as of December 31, 2024, the Public Services Agency (PSA) registered 2 406 economic agents from the Transnistrian region. This is 77,7% more than in 2014, when only 1 354 entrepreneurs were registered. Of these, 1 976 economic agents were temporarily registered, and 430 received permanent registration in accordance with the provisions of Government Decision No. 815/2005. This trend is in line with the national and international commitments of the Republic of Moldova, aimed at regulating and monitoring economic activity throughout the country.

Entrepreneurs from the Transnistrian region currently carry out commercial operations mainly with the European Union, as well as with the right-bank of the Republic of Moldova. Exports from the Transnistrian region to the EU member states reached a record level of 83% in 2024. At the same time, economic agents from the eastern districts of the country and the municipality of Bender, registered with the PSA, continue to carry out foreign trade activities using certificates of origin of goods, in accordance with current international and national standards.

During 2024, according to the Chamber of Commerce and Industry and the Customs Service, 6 061 certificates of origin of goods of the national standard were issued to the above categories of entrepreneurs, including „EUR.1” (3 857 certificates), „Form A” (28 certificates), „ST-1” (849 certificates) and „Form C” (1 327 certificates), which complies with the provisions of the World Trade Organization agreements and national legislation.
