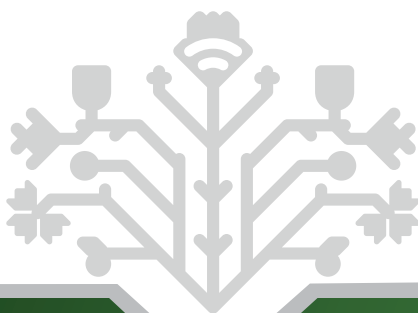

Dear Readers,

The Republic of Moldova remains firmly committed to the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, adopted by the Member States of the United Nations in 2015 as a universal framework for advancing sustainable, inclusive and resilient development. The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) continue to guide national efforts aimed at improving people's well-being, reducing inequalities, protecting the environment and strengthening institutions, while ensuring that no one is left behind.

Since the presentation of the first Voluntary National Review in 2020, the Republic of Moldova has made important progress in strengthening the national framework for monitoring the SDGs and aligning it with evolving international and European standards. In the context of the country's European integration process and EU candidate status, the national statistical system has intensified efforts to harmonize methodologies, improve data quality and expand the availability of indicators in line with the European statistical acquis and global SDG monitoring requirements.

The National Bureau of Statistics, as the coordinator of the national statistical system, together with ministries, public institutions and development partners, continues to lead the development and dissemination of SDG indicators in the Republic of Moldova. Following the revision of the national SDG monitoring framework in 2025, the set of indicators was further aligned with updated global metadata and European Union standards, ensuring greater relevance, comparability and policy coherence.

We are pleased to note that the availability of SDG indicators has improved compared to 2020, with the share of available indicators increasing by around 5 percentage points. This progress has been supported by ongoing investments in statistical capacity and the implementation of new statistical surveys designed to address existing data gaps and emerging policy needs. Among the most important initiatives for the period 2025-2027 are the surveys on Children's Activities, Time Use, Women's Well-being and Safety, Population Health (EHIS), Income and Living Conditions (EU-SILC), Tourism Demand in Households, and ICT Usage in Households, as well as other innovation activities within the national statistical system.

These surveys will contribute to the production of new and internationally comparable indicators related to quality of life, unpaid care and domestic work, gender-based violence, health status and access to healthcare, digital inclusion, tourism behavior, social exclusion and living conditions, thereby strengthening the evidence base for national policymaking and SDG monitoring.

In the context of the second Voluntary National Review of the Republic of Moldova, the National Bureau of Statistics is pleased to present this statistical annex, which provides a concise overview of the country's progress towards the Sustainable Development Goals through key statistical indicators and data visualizations. The publication includes selected indicators disaggregated by sex, age, area and other relevant characteristics, reflecting the commitment to the "leave no one behind" principle. The full set of national SDG indicators is available on the official [SDG dissemination platform](#) managed by the National Bureau of Statistics.

On behalf of the National Bureau of Statistics of the Republic of Moldova, I would like to express sincere appreciation to all national institutions, international organizations, development partners and data providers whose collaboration and support contributed to the preparation of this publication. We hope that this statistical annex will serve as a useful reference for policymakers, researchers, development partners and the wider public in understanding Moldova's progress towards sustainable development and European integration objectives.

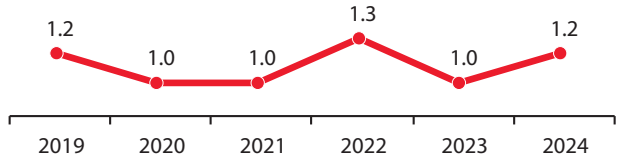

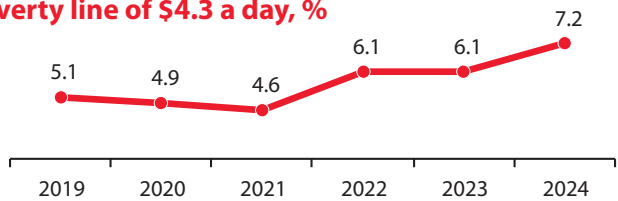


1.1.1.1 Proportion of population below the international poverty line of \$4.3 a day, %

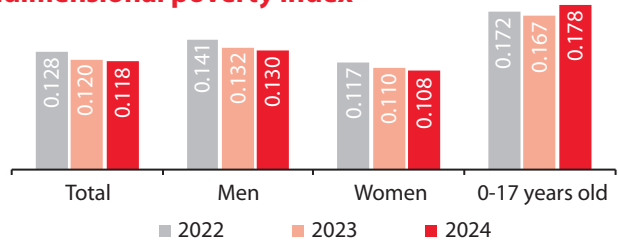

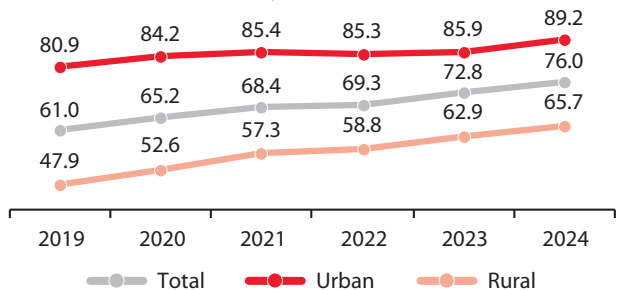

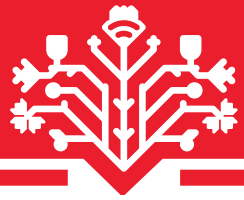


1.4.1 Proportion of population living in households with access to basic services, by area, %

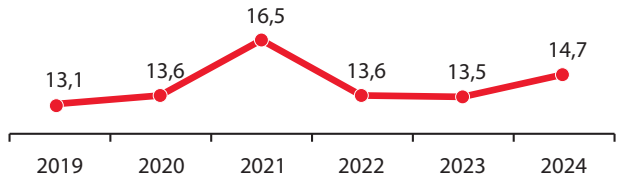
1.a.2 Proportion of national public budget spending on sectors, %



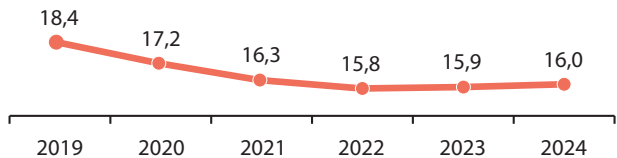

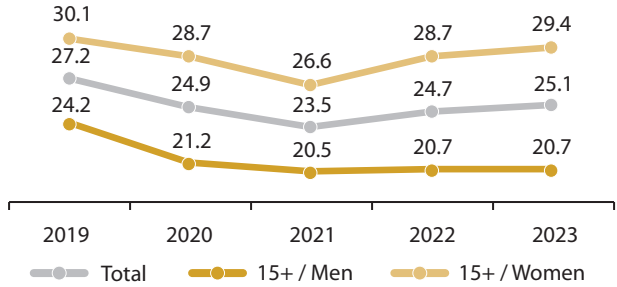

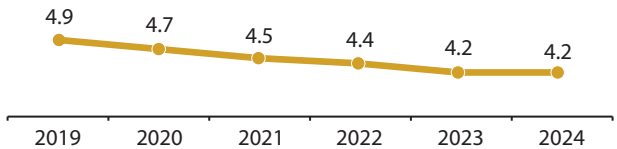
2.1.2 Prevalence of moderate or severe food insecurity, %

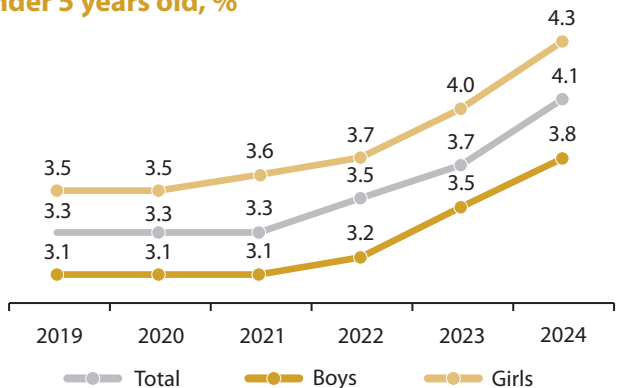
2.2.1 Prevalence of stunting among children under 5 years old, %

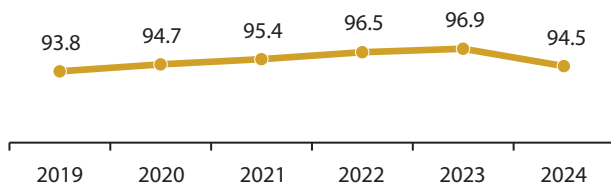
2.3.1.1 Proportion of sown areas in total agricultural fields, %

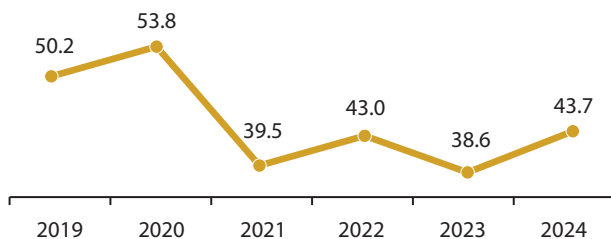


2.3.2 Proportion of small agricultural producers production volume in total agricultural production, %

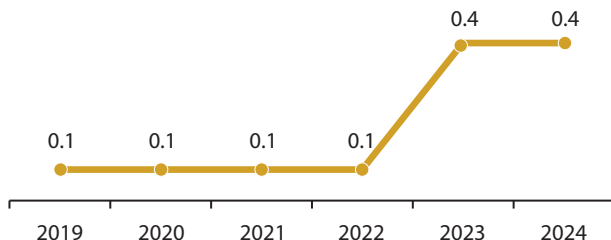


2.a.1 The agriculture orientation index for government expenditures, %

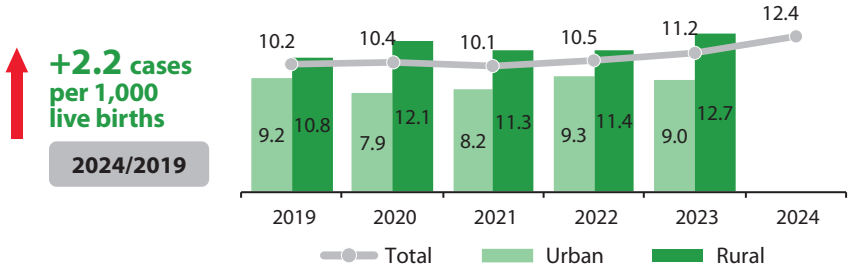

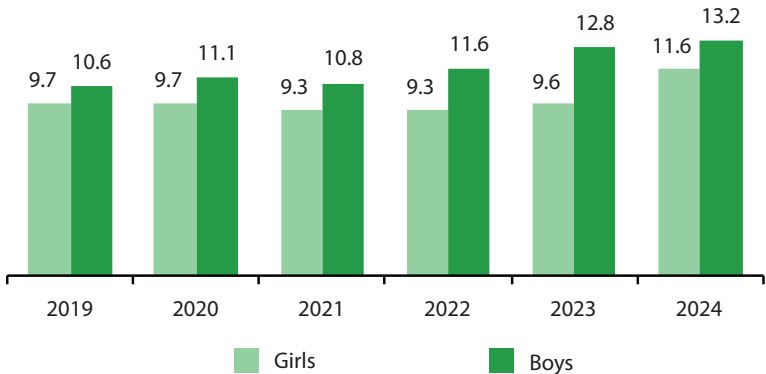

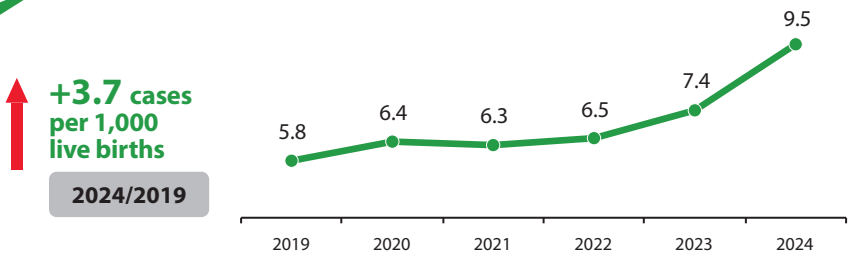
3.2.1 Mortality rate for children aged 0-4 years, per 1,000 live-births, by area

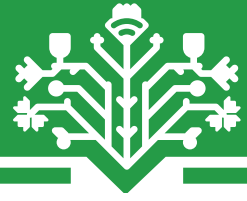


3.2.1 Mortality rate for children aged 0-4 years, per 1,000 live-births, by sex

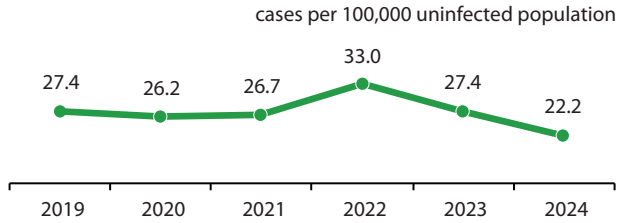

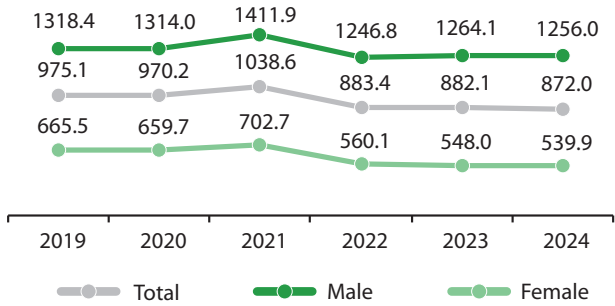

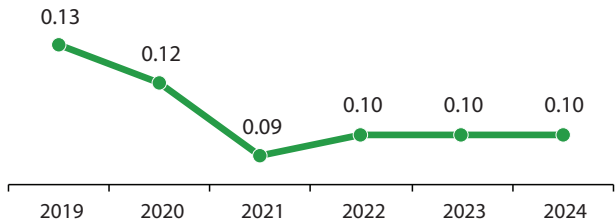
3.7.2 Adolescent birth rate at age 10-14 and 15-19 years per 1,000 women in the respective age group

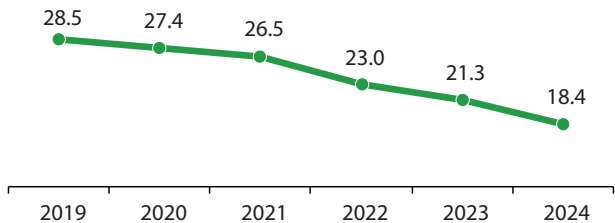


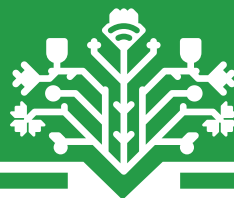

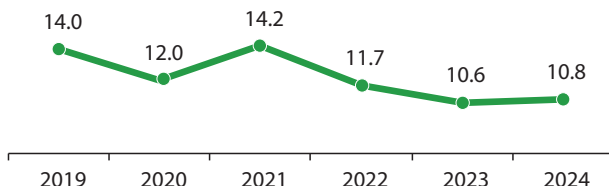


3.8.2.a Proportion of population with household expenditures on health larger than 10% of total household expenditure, %

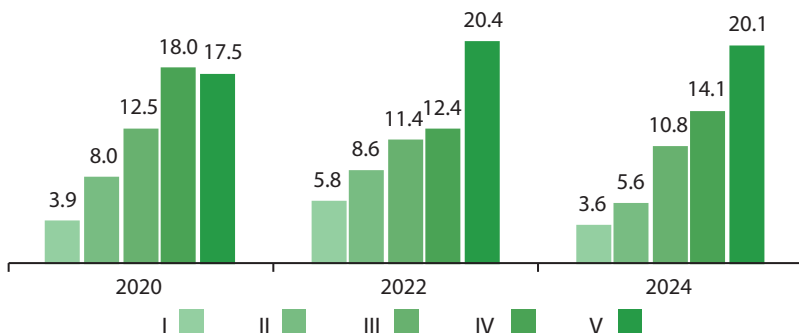

3.c.1 Number of health workers, per 10,000 population

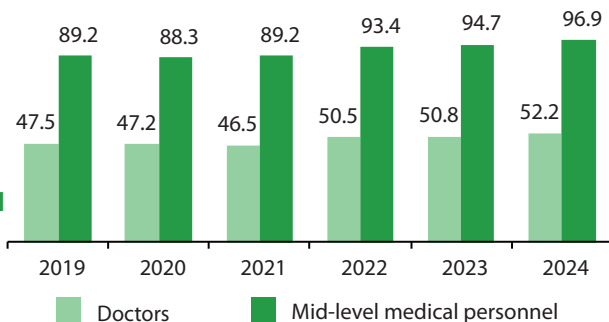

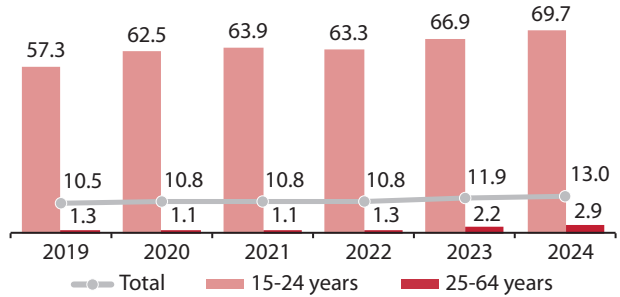


4.3.1 Participation rate of youth and adults in formal and non-formal lifelong education, %

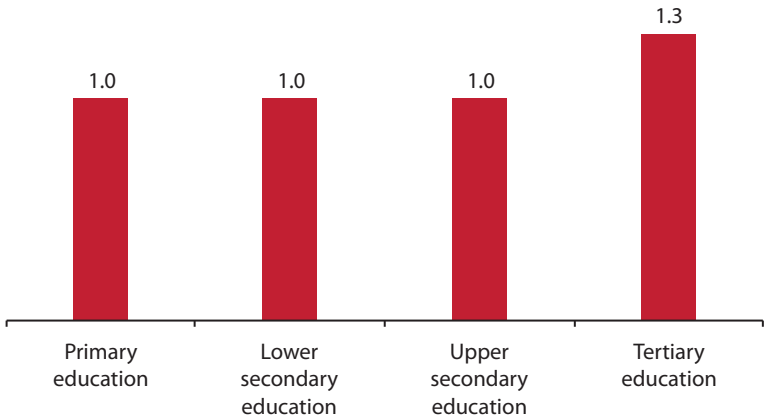


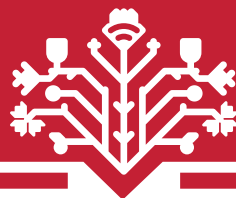

4.5.1 Parity index (female/male) per education level calculated on the basis of corresponding gross enrollment rates, 2024, %



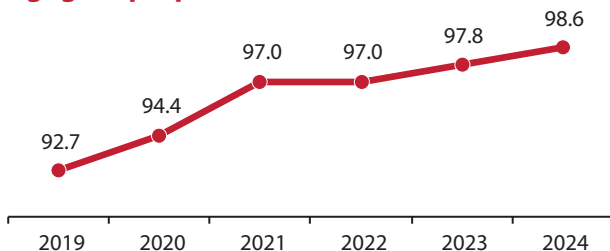


4.a.1.b Proportion of schools with access to Internet for pedagogical purposes, %

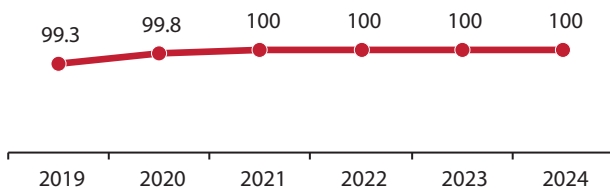


4.a.1.c Proportion of schools with access to computers for pedagogical purposes, %

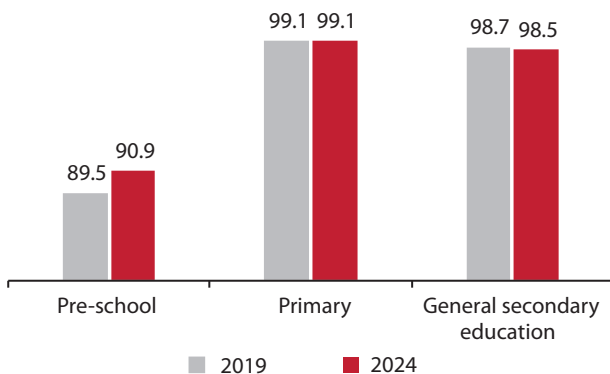

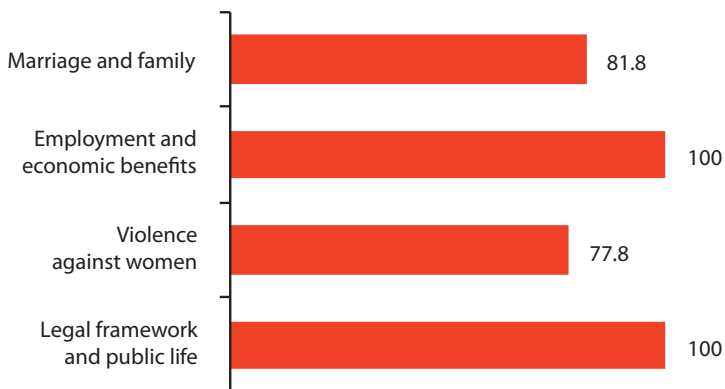

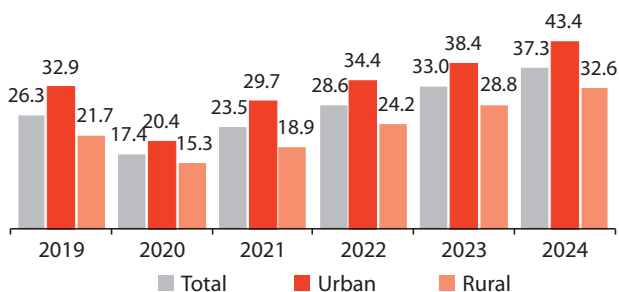
5.1.1 Existence of legal framework to promote, enforce and monitor equality and non-discrimination on the basis of sex, by areas of law, 2024, %

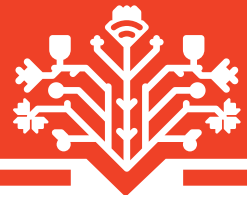


5.4.1.2 Coverage of children up to 3 years old with early education, %

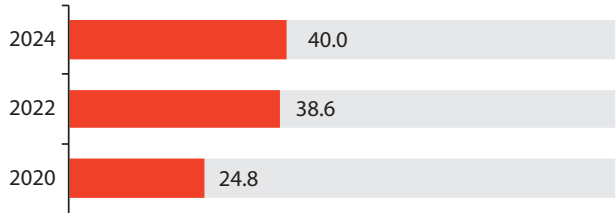


5.5.1.a Proportion of seats held by women in the national Parliament, %

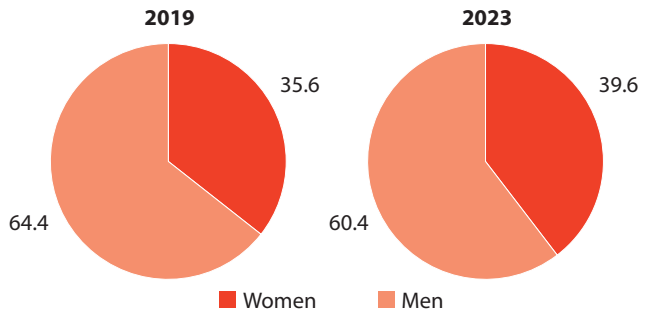


5.5.1.b Proportion of seats held by women in local public administration, %

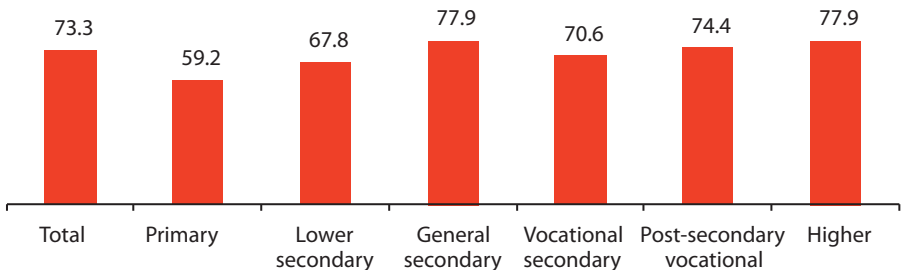

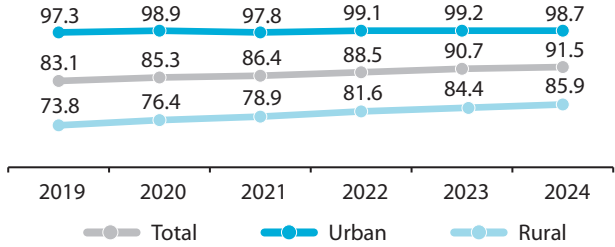


6.1.1 Proportion of population using safely managed drinking water sources, by area, %

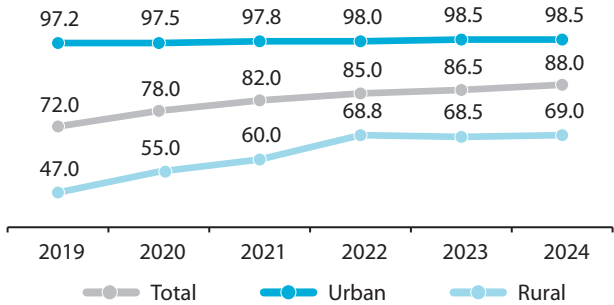
6.1.1.1 Proportion of population with access to safely managed drinking water supplied services, %

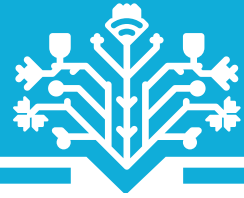
6.2.1.a Proportion of population connected to the public sewerage system, %

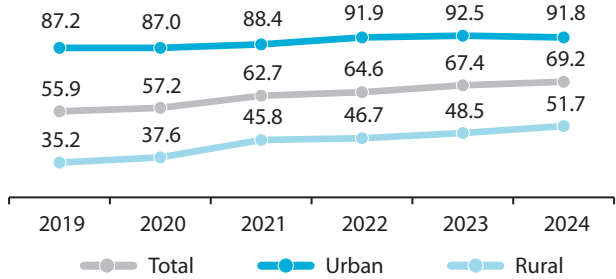




6.2.1.1 Proportion of population having a sanitation service and bath or shower within the dwelling, %

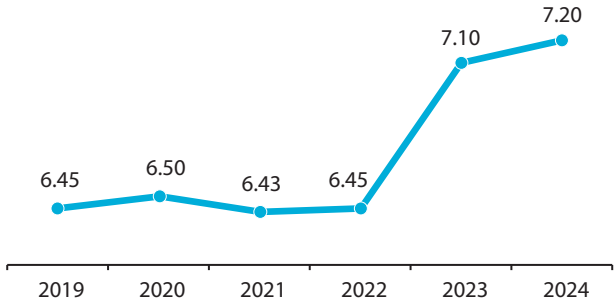

7.1.2 Proportion of households, by primary energy sources used for domestic needs, %

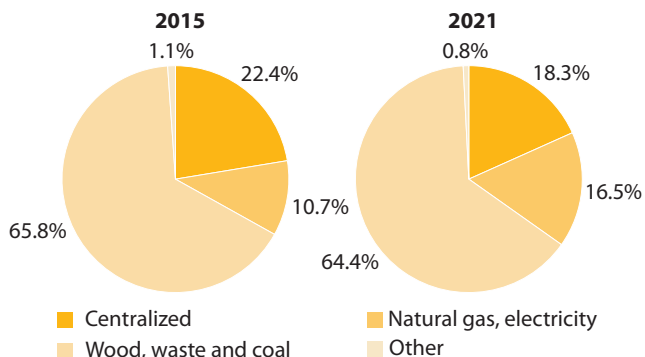

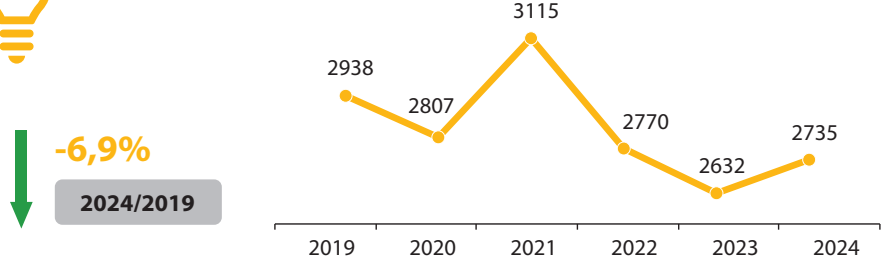




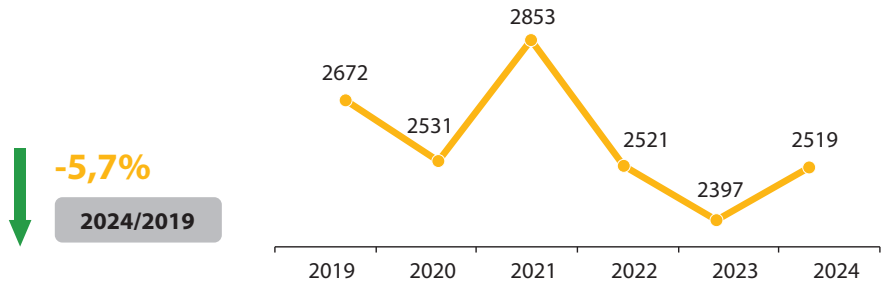
7.2.1 Renewable energy share in the total final energy consumption, %

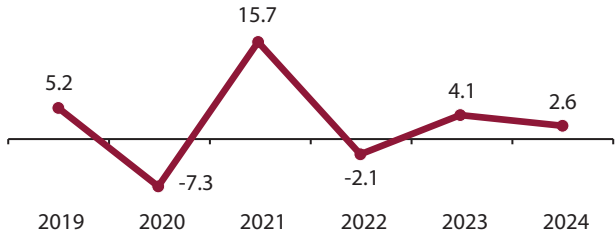


8.1.1 Annual growth rate of real GDP per capita (comparable prices), %

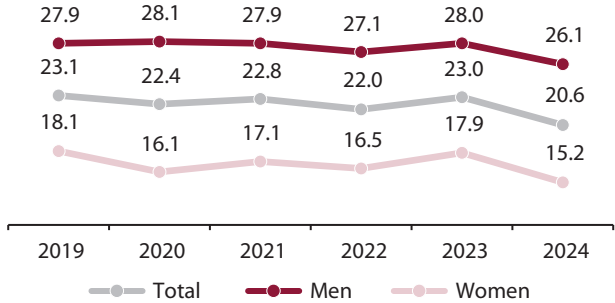


8.3.1 Proportion of informal employment in sector, by sex, %

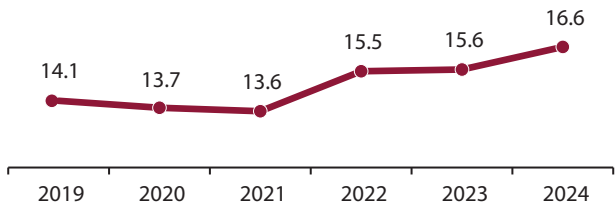
8.5.1.1 Gender pay gap, %

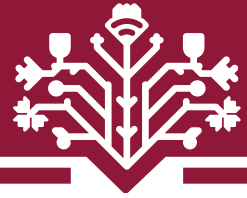

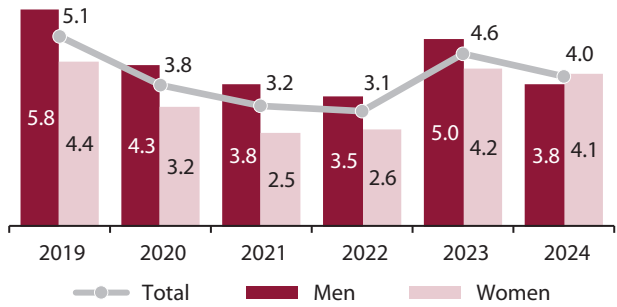


8.5.2 Unemployment rate, by sex, %

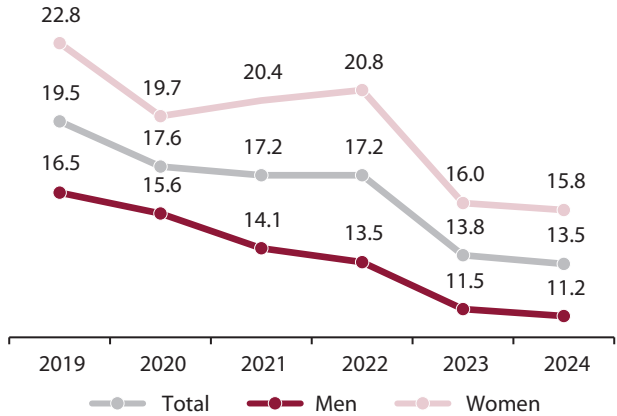


8.6.1 Proportion of youth (aged 15-24 years) not in education, employment or training, by sex, %

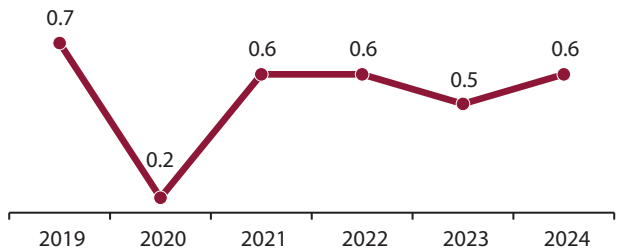
8.9.1.1 Share of tourism in GDP, %

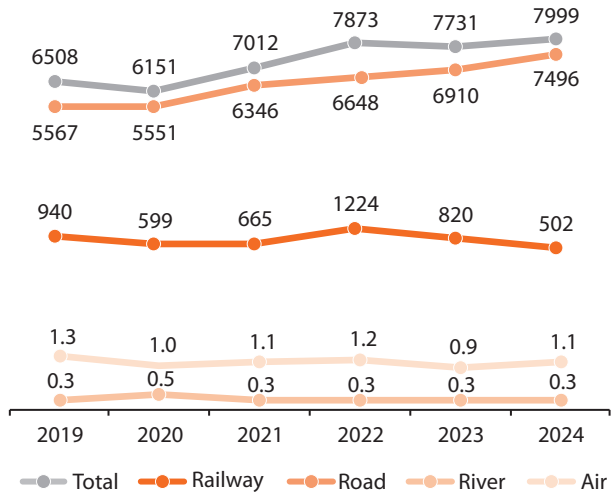

9.1.2.a Freight record by mode of transport, million tone-km

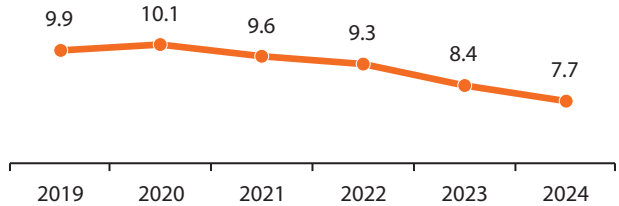

9.2.1.1 Manufacturing gross value added as a proportion of GDP, %

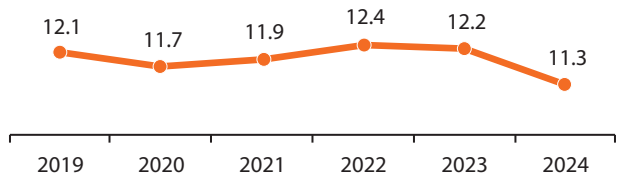

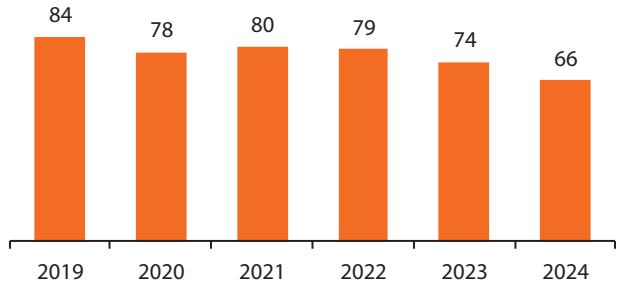


9.5.2 Researchers (in full-time equivalent) per 100,000 inhabitants

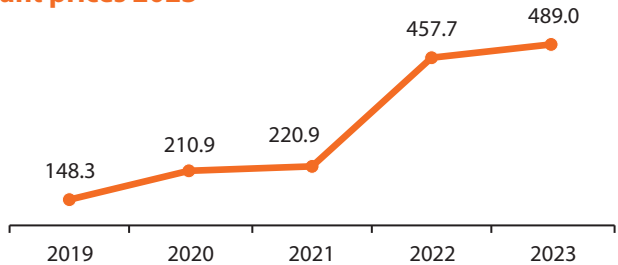


9.a.1 Value of external financial and technical assistance for infrastructure development, million USD, constant prices 2023

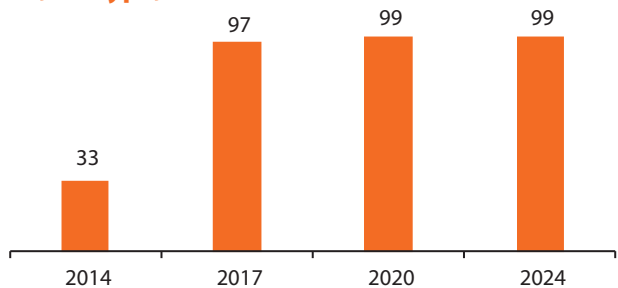


9.c.1 Proportion of population covered by a mobile network, 4G type, %

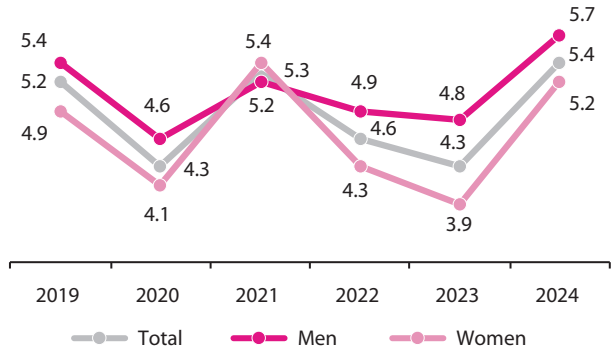


10.2.1 Proportion of persons living below 50% of median consumption expenditure, %

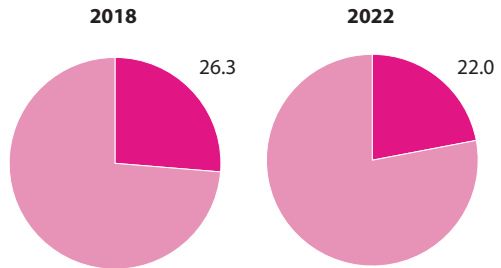


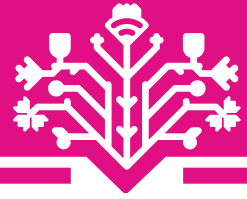
10.3.1 Proportion of population reporting having personally felt discriminated against or harassed in the previous 12 months, %



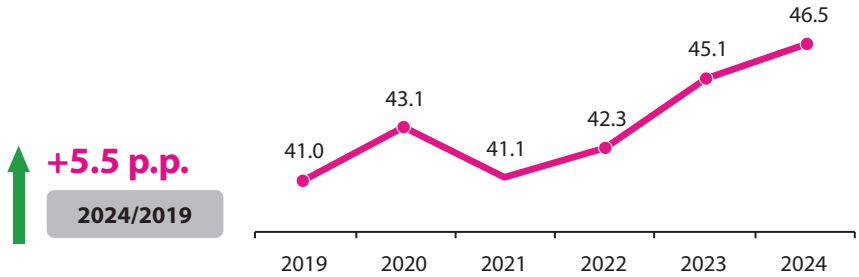

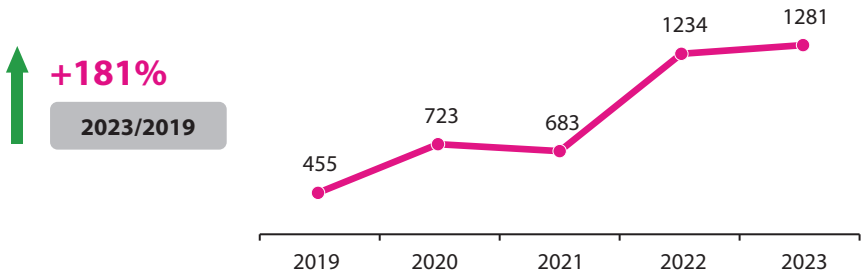




10.4.1 Proportion of the labour force costs in the Gross Domestic Product, %

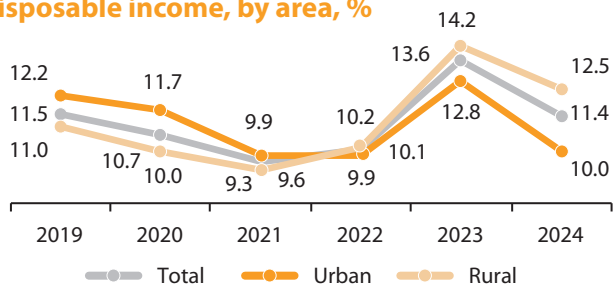


11.1.1.a. Proportion of population with monthly expenditures for dwelling maintenance that exceed 30% of the household monthly disposable income, by area, %

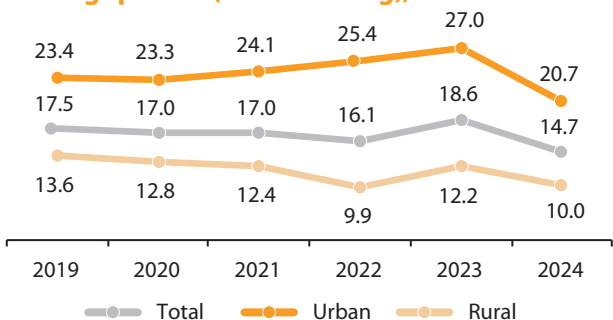

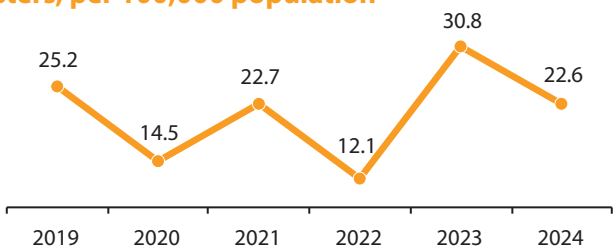


11.5.1.c. Number of directly affected persons attributed to disasters, per 100,000 population

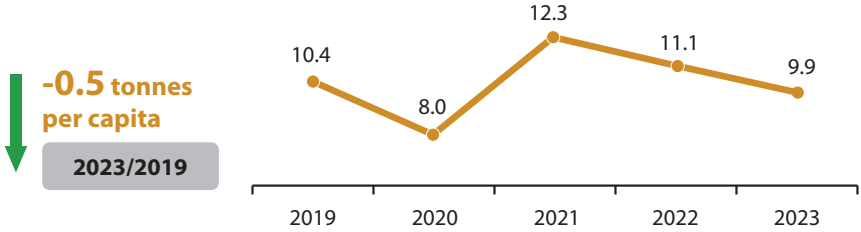

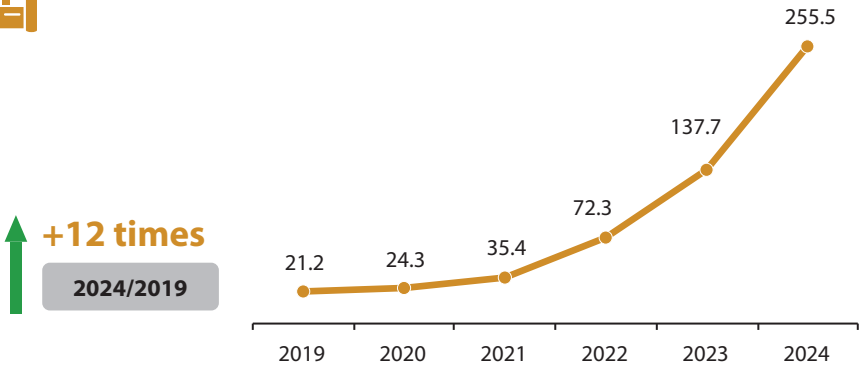

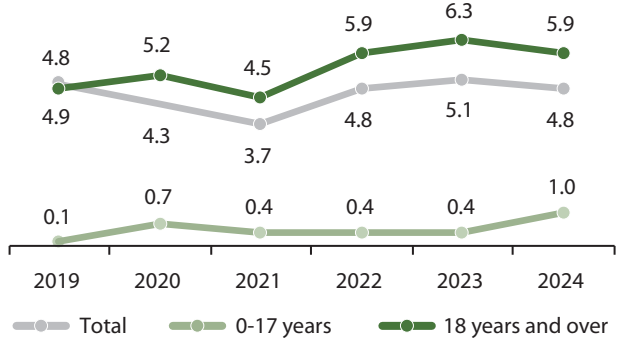

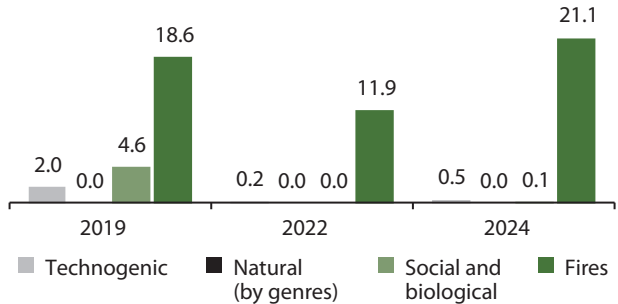

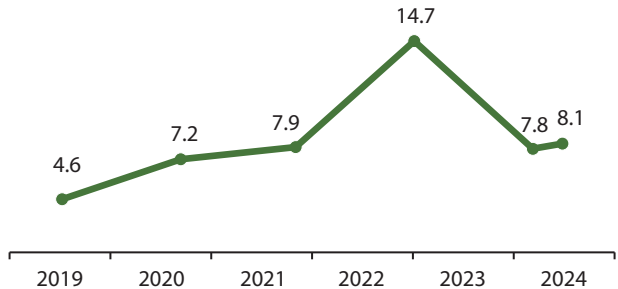


13.1.3.1 Proportion of irrigated land for soil drought mitigation in total irrigable land area, %

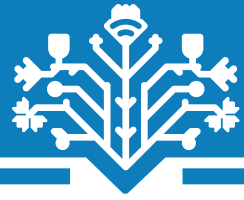

14.1.1.1 Chemical indices of surface water eutrophication, %

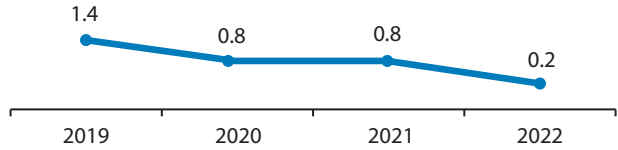

Nitrate concentration - mgN / l

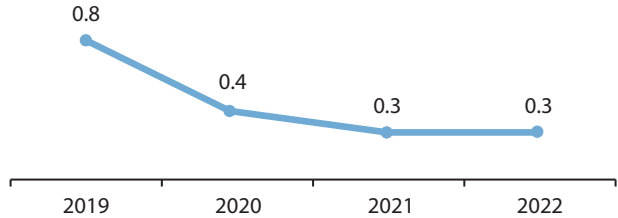


Phosphate concentration - mgP / l

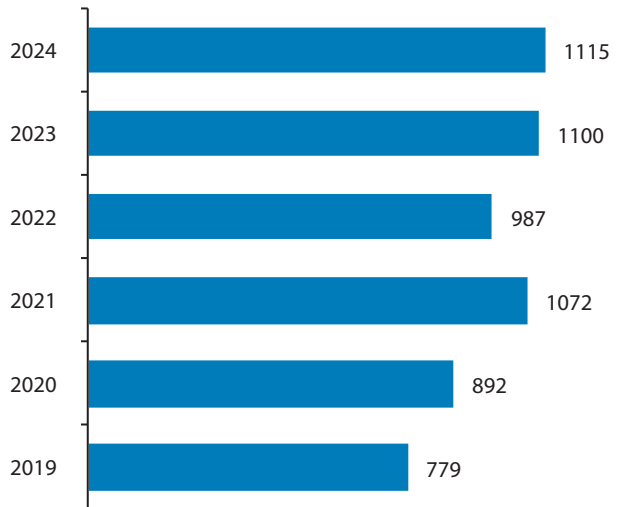

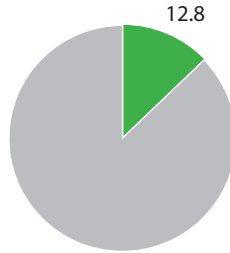


15.1.1 Forest fund area as a proportion of total land area, %

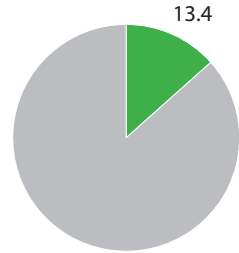

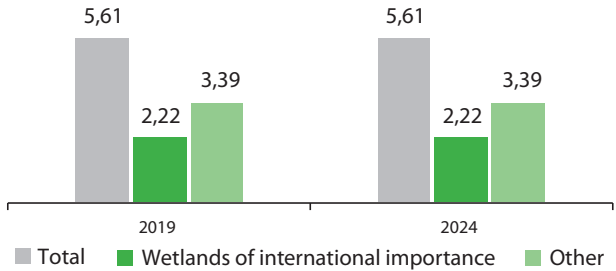

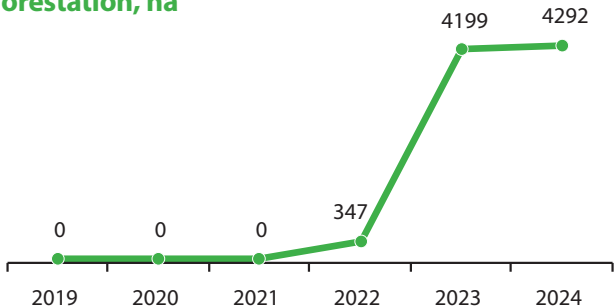
15.2.1.1 Area of degraded land recovered through reforestation, ha

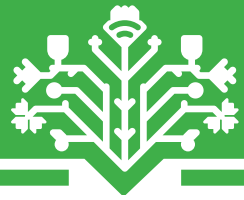

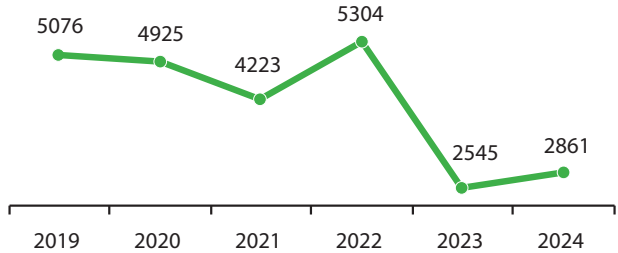
15.2.1.2 Area of restored forest, ha

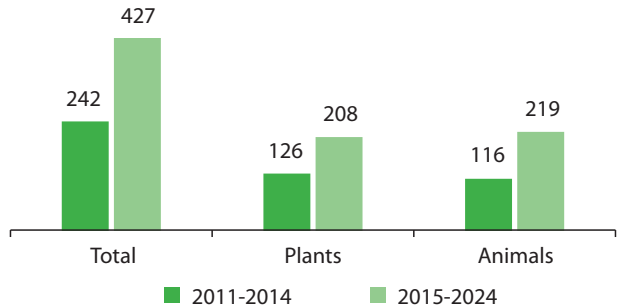

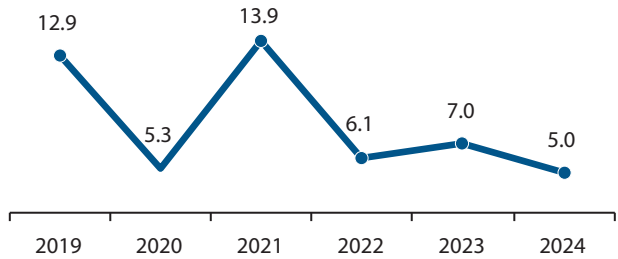


16.2.2 Number of victims of human trafficking per 100,000 population

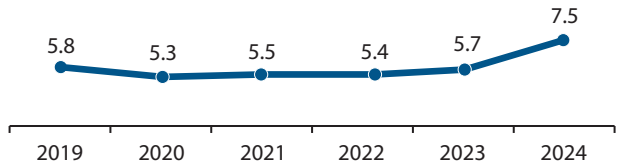


16.3.2 Unsentenced detainees as a proportion of overall prison population, %

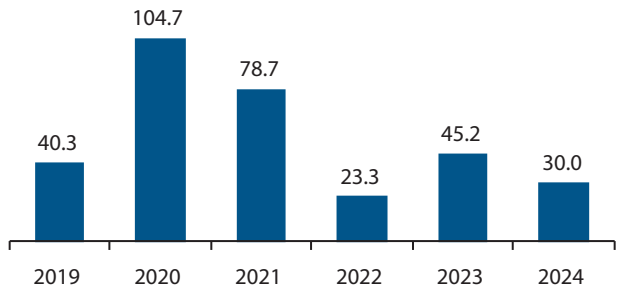
16.3.2.3 Proportion of court cases lost at ECHR¹ out of the number of applications communicated every year, %

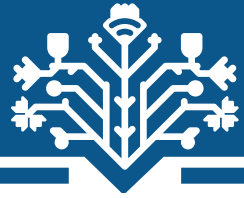

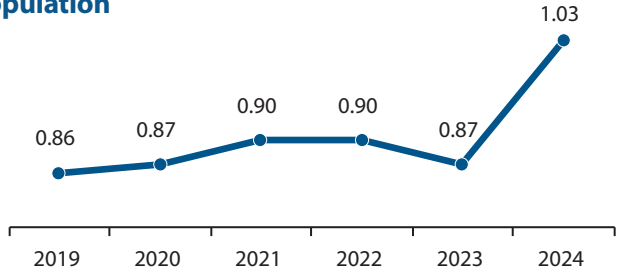

16.7.1.b Ratio of women holding positions in public authorities to women's share in the total population

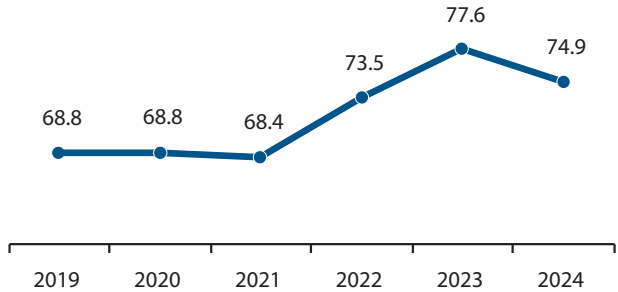

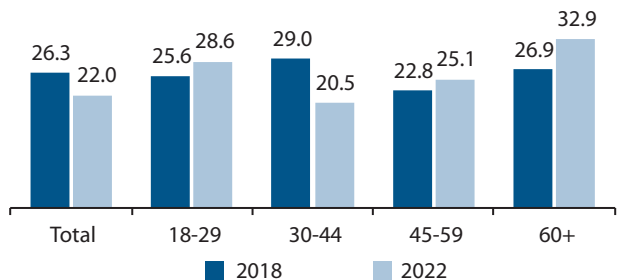

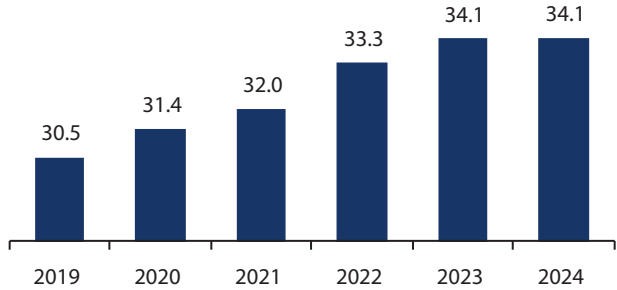


17.1.1 Total government revenue as a proportion of GDP, %

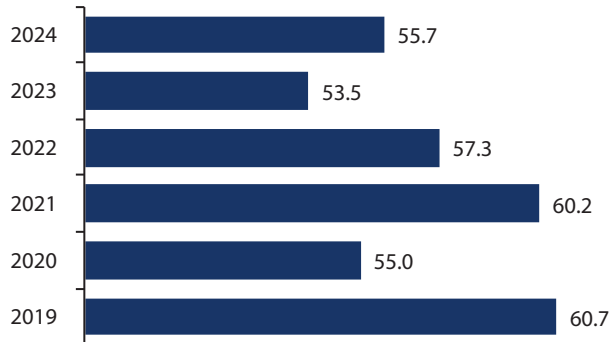


17.1.2 Ratio of tax revenue to total national government expenditure, %

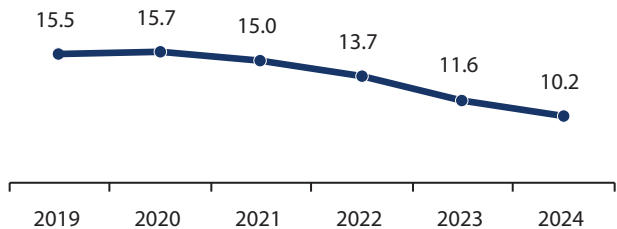


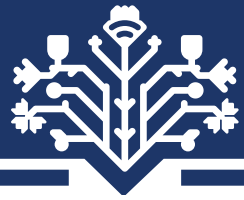
17.3.2 Volume of personal remittances as a percentage of GDP (recalculated in US dollars), %

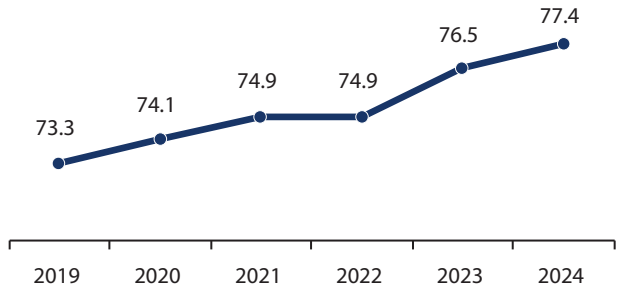


17.8.1 Proportion of individuals using the Internet, %

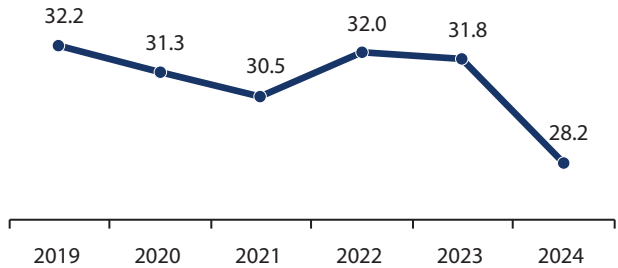
17.11.1.1 Exports of goods from the Republic of Moldova as a proportion of country's foreign trade, %

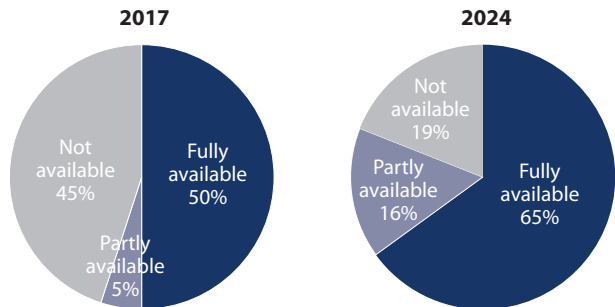


17.18.1 Proportion of sustainable development indicators produced at the national level, %
